This statement demonstrates our commitment to legal compliance, ethical standards and fundamental human rights as set out by the principles of the ILO/UN Guiding Principles.

Arc Group recognises that it has a responsibility to take a robust approach to slavery and human trafficking. ARC Group is absolutely committed to preventing slavery and human trafficking in our activities, and to ensuring that our supply chains are free from slavery and human trafficking

Public Interest Disclosure (whistleblowing)

to the direct activities, or the supply chains of, the organisation. The Public Interest Procedure is designed to
make it easy for workers to make disclosures, without fear of retaliation.

Arc Group provides advice and guidance to staff that includes references to modern slavery and trafficking

Recruitment & Selection Policy

Arc Group uses reputable employment agencies to source staffing requirements. It verifies the practices of
any new agency used before accepting workers from that agency. ARC Group ensures that all approved
recruitment agencies conduct all relevant pre-recruitment checks and provide evidence that all such checks
have been conducted.

Due diligence processes for slavery and human trafficking

- All employees and persons employed within ARC are asked to familiarise themselves with our policies at the start of their employment or association and are contractually obligated to adhere to the ARC's policies.
- We are satisfied from our own due diligence measures that there is no evidence of any act of modern-day slavery or human trafficking within our own organisation.
- ARC will not knowingly support or deal with any businesses found to be involved with any acts of slavery or human trafficking.
- ARC has a policy of zero-tolerance on matters of slavery and/or human trafficking and expects suppliers and associated businesses to comply with these values.
- Most ARC's sources are from inside the United Kingdom and as such are less at risk of slavery and human trafficking issues.

Responsibility for the statement

Ultimate responsibility for the prevention and prevention of modern slavery within the organisation rests with ARC's Managing Director. Managers, at all levels, are responsible for ensuring those reporting to them understand and comply with this statement.

Communication and awareness of this statement

This statement is displayed on throughout the organisation and a is conveyed to all staff members at their induction. This policy is also communicated with our supply chain where necessary. ARC Group also ensures that staff undertake training on modern slavery and engages with external training providers, as appropriate.

This statement has been approved by ARC Group's Directors on 21.07.2020 and will be reviewed and updated annually as part of the review of policies planned via the Quality Calendar
